### East Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty

The East Devon AONB is a striking landscape, full of contrast and colour, geology and wildlife.. Tranquil estuaries, sheer red mudstone cliffs, intimate wooded combs and coves contrast with the stark, white chalk outcrop that punctuates the coast at Beer Head or the wilderness area east of the river Axe known as the Undercliffs.

Inland, the heathland commons provide high, open, remote plateaux, valuable for their wildlife, which contrast sharply with the lower, undulating agricultural mosaic of small fields, hedgerows and wooded copses.

### World Heritage Site

The Dorset and East Devon World Heritage Site, popularly known as the Jurassic Coast, covers around 95 miles of stunningly beautiful coast and is rich in geological importance, which represents 185 million years of earth history. This international recognition places the coastline alongside some of the most famous and familiar names in the world such as the Great Barrier Reef, the Galapagos Islands and the Giants Causeway.

### South West Coast Path National Trail

The South West Coast Path National Trail is a 630 mile adventure around the coast line of the south-west. It is simply the best way to enjoy the scenery, wildlife and heritage of our wonderful coastline.

# COASTHOPPER 899 JURASSICCOAST



The **COASTHOPPER 899** gives you access to some of the most spectacular sections of coast line between Seaton and Sidmouth. It gives walkers excellent opportunities to widen their walking options, instead of taking the car and having to walk round in a circle, or retracing your footsteps catch the bus for a change. By hopping onto the bus at the start of the day and letting it drop you off at the start of your walk it takes away any worries about getting to the bus stop on time, allowing you to relax and admire the outstanding views. There are lots of interesting attractions to start your walk from and cafes or pubs to call at on the way.

If you do not fancy a walk then remember that views from the bus are much better, and you have got time to enjoy them, as when on a bus you can see over the top of the Devon hedges to take in the more distant views. So just sit there and let the bus driver worry about the narrow lanes and who is going to do the reversing!

To help you plan your day we have calculated how far it is from various points along the bus route. Please use Ordnance Survey Explorer maps 115 and 116 to plan your route.

### Sidmouth

Many Regency and Victorian buildings give Sidmouth its unique character. It has won awards for the floral displays, Connaught Gardens and the main pebble beach.

### Norman Lockyer Observatory

The Norman Lockyer Observatory is the UK's home of astrophysics! This working optical observatory is also open to the public at certain times.

### The Donkey Sanctuary

The Donkey Sanctuary is home to over 400 rescued donkeys with walks in beautiful surroundings where you can meet the donkeys, who adore the fuss and attention received from visitors.



### Branscombe

Branscombe is one of the most picturesque of East Devon's many villages, it sweeps down along a spectacularcombe, past colourful cottages down to the sea. There are pretty rows of thatched cottages with hanging baskets and climbing roses, and a church with one of the most inspiring views in the county.



### Beer Quarry Caves

A complex of underground caverns created by centuries of quarrying the famous Beer Stone as used in Exeter Cathedral and Westminster Abbey. Also an internationally important home for bats.

### Pecorama

Pecorama is a must for the model railway enthusiast, along with the Beer Heights Light Railway and extensive gardens to inspire and enjoy.

### Beer

A beautiful seaside fishing village and resort, enjoy the sunshine on a sheltered beach or ramble on the cliffs and in the surrounding unspoilt countryside.



### Seaton

The gentle sweep of the mile of open coastline makes Seaton a delightful coastal town where holidaymakers have been coming for generations. Home to the Seaton Tramway that runs all the way up to Colyton taking in the spectacular birdlife of the Axe valley.
